Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by Chairman Scott Fetchenhier. Present were Commissioners Ernie Kuhlman and Austin Lashley, and Administrator William Tookey.

Payment of Bills: Commissioner Kuhlman moved to authorize payment of the warrants as presented. Commissioner Lashley seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Minutes: Commissioner Kuhlman moved to approve the minutes of December 15, 2022 as presented. Commissioner Lashley seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimous.

Chairman Scott Fetchenhier declared the business of 2022 to be completed.

Upon completion of old business, the Commissioners thanked Commissioner Kuhlman for his 32 years of service as a San Juan County Commissioner.

County Judge Anthony Edwards then swore in the newly elected officials.

At 9:40 A.M. the Commissioners reconvened the meeting. The Commissioners began their board reorganization for 2023 with Commissioners Fetchenhier, Lashley and Maisel in attendance.

Commissioner Fetchenhier moved to appoint Commissioner Lashley to serve as the County Commissioner Chairman for the year 2023. Commissioner Maisel seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously. Chairman Lashley will be added as a signature to the County accounts.

Commissioner Maisel moved to appoint Commissioner Fetchenhier to serve as the Commissioner Pro Tem for the year 2023. Commission Lashley seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Chairman Lashley called the meeting to order. Present were Commissioners Scott Fetchenhier and Pete Maisel, and Administrator William Tookey.

Public Health Director Becky Joyce was present to provide the Commissioners with an update on the Public Health activities.

Social Services Director Martha Johnson was present to provide the Commissioners with a monthly update. Commissioner Fetchenhier moved to approve the 2023 CDHS Certification of Compliance. Commissioner Maisel seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Commissioner Fetchenhier moved to approve Transmittal #10 in the amount of \$7444.07. Commissioner Maisel seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Commissioner Fetchenhier moved to approve Transmittal #11 in the amount of \$8472.21. Commissioner Maisel seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Commissioner Fetchenhier moved to approve Contract Amendment #2 with the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing as submitted. Commissioner Maisel seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

SJDA Beth Kremer was present to provide the Commissioners with an update on the activities of San Juan Development Association. She also informed the Board about the upcoming Southwest Rural Philanthropy Days and requested \$1000.00 donation. Commissioner Fetchenhier moved to donate \$1000 to the Southwest Rural Philanthropy Days with the funding to come from Lodgers Tax. Commissioner Maisel seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Erick Loyer with Rock Pirates was present to discuss his 2020 operations in Howardsville and to get feedback as to any concerns that the Commissioners may have so that they could be addressed during the 2023 season. The Commissioners noted that they had received minimal comments concerning the operation and felt that it had been operated within the conditions as set for in his Land Use Permit.

Aaron Brill, representing CORE Mountain Enterprises LLC was present to request that the CORE Mountain PUD be amended the language for the previously approved two lifts to be changed from surface lifts to chair lifts. It was the consensus of the Commissioners to hold a public hearing during the January 25, 2023 meeting on this subject before they make a determination.

Melissa Smeins and Lisa Merrill of the BLM were present to discuss drainage issues with the Forest Queen site. It was the consensus of the Commissioners that thy set up a meeting with their engineer and Road Supervisor Girodo to come up with a solution.

Jake Kurzweil and Melissa May were present to provide the Commissioners with an update on MSI.

Commissioner Maisel moved to adopt Resolution 2023-01 Commissioner Kuhlman Thank You. Commissioner Fetchenhier seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

The Annual Treasurer's Report was presented to the Commissioners for their review. Commissioner Maisel moved to approve the Treasurer's report as submitted. Commissioner Fetchenhier seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Commissioner Fetchenhier moved to designate the 1557 Greene St. Courthouse Entrance as the official location for the posting of meetings. Commissioner Maisel seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Anthony Edwards was present to discuss a proposed Development Agreement with the Town of Silverton for the development of 10 affordable/workforce housing units at the Anvil Mountain Subdivision. Commissioner Fetchenhier moved to approve the Development Agreement contingent upon any necessary changes that may be made or approved by the County Attorney. Commissioner Maisel seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Edwards also requested a letter of support for the Division of Housing Grant that the Town was pursuing to implement the development of the 10 housing units. Commissioner Fetchenhier moved to have the County submit a letter of support. Commissioner Maisel seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Mark Rudolph of CDPHE was present to provide the Commissioners with a quick update and answer questions concerning upcoming superfund activities.

A public hearing was held to receive comments concerning the amendments the current Improvement Permit for C&G Alpine Partners to allow for a water storage pond on the former Wildcat Lode and Development of a Parking Area on the Anglo Saxon Placer. Mr. Nick Croce was present to represent the applicant and Lisa Adair was provide the Commissioners with information concerning the application.

Upon completion of the public hearing Commissioner Fetchenhier moved to amend the Improvement Permit for C&G Partners with the conditions as recommended by Planning Commission and staff.

The Commissioners were provided with a Sales Tax update.

A Public Hearing was held to receive comment concerning the request from Aaron Brill representing CORE Mountain to amend the CORE Mountain PUD to change the approval from surface lifts to chairlifts.

Upon completion of the public hearing Commissioner Maisel moved to approve the PUD Amendment as requested to allow the two previously approved surface lifts to be amended to allow for two chairlifts as located in the original approval. Commissioner Fetchenhier seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously. Before any construction of a chairlift can be constructed CORE Mountain will be required to submit a Land Use Permit for Administrative Review.

The Boards and Offices for 2023 was presented to the Commissioners for their consideration. Commissioner Fetchenhier moved to approve the Boards and Offices with the changes as agreed upon. Commissioner Maisel seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.



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

EPA outlines 2023 Bonita Peak cleanup priorities

Agency has several large projects in the Silverton Superfund site on next year's schedule



Representatives from the Environmental Protection Agency have made the rounds this week presenting their 2022 accomplishments and priority projects for the next year in the Bonita Peak Mining District Superfund site. Officials from the agency met with both La Plata County commissioners and the Superfund site's Community Advisory Group.

The site contains 48 abandoned mines within three drainages that feed into the Animas River, Studies and remediation work have been ongoing ever since San Juan County and the town of Silverton requested a Superfund designation after the 2015 Gold King Mine spill. In addition to yearly bulkhead inspections and seepage studies to determine how water might infiltrate into and weaken existing tunnel systems, the EPA and partner agencies completed a number of remediation and reclamation projects. Those included moving the tailings at the North Star Mine site to prevent water from seeping through into Mineral Creek (a tributary of the Animas River), lining various containment ponds and altering ground topography to prevent pooling.

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Notably, partners completed remediation work at Campground 4, an unofficial dispersed camping site located northeast of Silverton. The site contained lead levels that reached upward of 80,000 parts per million. The EPA defines a yard with bare soil containing 1,200 ppm as hazard to a child.

A report released by the Agency for Toxic Substances and Disease Registry in December found that lead levels in a number of dispersed campground sites reached dangerous levels for children and pregnant women. However, the risk at Campground 4 been mitigated by covering the area with cleaner soil and removing the most toxic material, but camping remains prohibited in the area.

The EPA created a storymap this year that allows the public to view updates on the work in the district.

Perhaps the biggest project slated for 2023 is the construction scheduled to begin in May on a repository for solid mine waste from the entire district. The project has been the topic of discussion for several years. Repositories can prevent human and environmental exposure to the heavy metals contained in mine tailings. The repository would have a 100-year life span, compared to the significantly shorter lifetime of the pond currently containing the sludge settled out of Gold King mine drainage at the Gladstone water treatment plant,

EPA's Community Involvement Coordinator for the site Meg Broughton told the CAG members that discussions with Silverton residents will occur in the coming months regarding details of construction, including which of the few routes through town construction crews will use.

The EPA will also hold a meeting and listening session in Silverton on Feb. 23 to discuss the possibility of actively treating water from draining mines that contribute the highest volume of contaminated water.
